This event is significant in as much as Serbia usually has its own youth gathering in May. Pastor Oliver felt that he should invite the Serbian youth to join them in Croatia and have a combined, West Balkan Wide, Youth Rally in Zagreb. Pastor Oliver was warmly received by Slobodan Angelic (leader of the Pentecostal movement in Serbian). This guy before the Vukovar reconciliation gathering had been very cool to the whole concept of reconciliation between Serbia and Croatia.

Oliver is of the opinion that this openness is as a direct result of the 2006 gathering in Vukovar. We receive frequent reports of how there is a whole spirit of change over the region and a real willingness of people to co-operate and work together, for His Glory. We feel so excited and privileged that God is allowing us, to see some of the results of our labor in these lands. We do hope that all you wonderful folk who support us in both with prayer and finances, feel as excited as we do. You are all very much part of the ministry here.
